*NTIA considers compliance with EHP under permitting requirements. These are different from permits required for broadband deployment such as right-of-way or easements. Applicants must complete EHP activities during the pre-contract phase but they are not required at the time of application submission. The OOB is required to certify the awardee's compliance with NEPA and NHPA prior to submission to NTIA for final approval before the initiation of deployment activities.



Section 2.4.5 NEPA and NHPA Breakdown

1. Compliance with NEPA and NHPA

The Office of Broadband is committed to ensuring that applicants seeking to deploy network facilities comply with all applicable NEPA and NHPA requirements*.

- Applicant must provide the following information at the time of application submission:
 - o Documentation demonstrating efforts and plans to secure all necessary EHP permits
 - o Documentation demonstrating efforts and plans to complete all required federal, state, and local EHP consultations/reviews
- · Awardee must complete and submit an Environmental Review Record (ERR) pursuant to NEPA and NHPA during the Pre-Contract phase
- Subgrantee must submit all required EHP permits to the OOB and receive approval from the NTIA prior to beginning construction or grounddisturbing activities prior per the BEAD NOFO.



- Each applicant must provide a narrative describing the applicant's readiness to comply with applicable environmental and national historical
 preservation requirements
- Each applicant must also provide a milestone schedule identifying specific deadlines and describing how the applicant proposes to meet these timing requirements including, as required, the completion of consultations, the completion of NEPA and Section 106 reviews, and the submission of Environmental Assessments (EAs) or Environmental Impact Statements (EISs)
- Certify that the applicant will complete all required permits, reviews, or consultations related to construction or ground-disturbing activities
 pursuant to NEPA and NHPA.
- · Certify that the applicant has included all necessary information required by the Office of Broadband and/or NTIA



EHP Actions Needed Prior to Project Start

The Virginia Office of Broadband will not allow subgrantees to begin any grant funded project implementation activities prior to the following:

- The completion of any review required under the <u>National Environmental Policy Act of 1969</u> (42 U.S.C. 4321, et seq.) (NEPA), and issuance by NTIA and the Grantee, as required, of a <u>Categorical Exclusion (Cat Ex</u>) determination, <u>Record of Environmental</u> <u>Consideration</u> (REC), <u>Finding of No Significant Impact</u> (FONSI), or <u>Record of Decision</u> (ROD) that meets the requirements of NEPA;
- The completion of reviews required under Section 106 of the <u>National Historic Preservation Act of 1966</u> (54 U.S.C. 300101, et seq.) (NHPA), including any consultations required by Federal law, to include consultations with the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO), and Federally recognized Native American tribes;
- The completion of consultations with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) or the National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS), as applicable, under <u>Section 7 of the Endangered Species Act</u> (16 U.S.C. 1531, et seq.), and/or consultations with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) under <u>Section 404 of the Clean Water Act</u> (33 U.S.C. 1251, et seq.), as applicable; and
- Demonstration of compliance with all other applicable Federal, state, and local environmental laws and regulations



Section 2.4.5 NEPA and NHPA Actions

The applicant is expected to complete the following task(s) to satisfy the requirements for Section 2.4.5, which are laid out on Page 86 – 87 <u>BEAD</u> <u>NOFO</u> and adopted by the Office of Broadband on Page 15 – 16 of their <u>Initial Proposal Volume 2</u>. Below are recommended best practices:

- Utilize the NTIA's permit mapping tool to assist in determining which federal EHP permits are necessary for your project area
- Collaborate with the OOB, and appropriate permitting agency to determine if <u>Categorical Exclusions</u>, <u>Environmental Assessments</u>, or <u>Environmental Impact Statements</u> are necessary for NEPA compliance
- Determine if the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (ACHP)'s Program Comment process is applicable to streamline NHPA Section 106 reviews
- Engage early and schedule consultations with the appropriate agencies to significantly reduces delays for EHP permit approvals
- Coordinate with state and local agencies as well as federal the Office of Broadband can help facilitate these discussions
- Ensure that EHP permit applications (most federal agencies use the SF-299) are thoroughly completed prior to submission to the agency
