



The Proposed Solution: Project VITAL

 A three-region approach to accelerating Virginia to becoming a premier destination for biotechnology startups.

Building on Momentum

- During the 2024 General Assembly Session, the 2024-2026 biennium budget included substantial investments of over \$90M in public research universities, including \$46M for UVA's Paul and Diane Manning Institute for Biotechnology, \$14.9M for VCU's Medicines for All Institute, and \$31M for Roanokebased Fralin Biomedical Research Institute.
- These investments are geared toward enhancing and accelerating the capacity of these research centers to develop state-of-the-art treatments and therapeutics.









Collaboration, Partnership, and GO Virginia's Role

- Partnership Three research universities working with key non-profit organizations to develop a statewide ecosystem for economic growth opportunities in the biotechnology industry.
- Collaboration Centralization of key assets to benefit the entire industry including accelerator programming, referral networks, startup pipelines, scientific expertise, shared equipment and space, procurement agreements, and venture capital relationships.
- GO Virginia's Role Making big investments in core components that are necessary to reap economic benefits from core research investments made by the general assembly including talent recruitment and retention strategies, customized bioscience programming, attraction of capital, creation of shared facilities, and coordinated branding.



V. Healthcare Task Force Report



- Action Item: Board Policy #17 Healthcare Industry Investments
 - This policy creates a defined path and criteria that would need to be satisfied to allow Regional Councils to pursue workforce projects in the healthcare industry sector. An applying region must satisfy the following criteria to be eligible:
 - Describe and document that the lack of healthcare services is affecting its ability to grow one or more of the industry clusters defined in its Growth and Diversification Plan.
 - The majority of the participating localities, by population, must have been designated as a Geographic Healthcare Professional Shortage area by the Health Resources and Services Administration.
 - The effort must be focused on expanding the pool of qualified workers in one or more of the occupations identified on the Virginia High Demand Occupation List as defined by the Virginia Office of Education Economics.
 - The Region must demonstrate that there is not sufficient capacity to train workers for those occupations.

- Action Item: Board Policy #4 Use of GO Virginia Funds to Promote the Growth of Traded Industry Clusters
 - It is the policy of the Virginia Growth and Opportunity Board that program funds shall be used to support the growth of prioritized traded industry clusters as identified in each Regional Council's Economic Growth and Diversification Plan.
 - A traded industry cluster is defined as industry sector(s) where the majority of goods and services are sold or have the potential to be sold outside the Commonwealth.
 - It is within the powers of the Board to adopt superseding policies that make targeted exceptions to this Policy should the Board identify challenges that would otherwise hinder the growth of traded industry clusters.
