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Virginia Make Ready Initiative (VMRI) Program Overview



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Program Description

- The 2024 General Assembly allocated up to \$30 million in funding to supplement current VATI projects funded from the State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund or the Capital Projects Fund of the American Rescue Plan Act for "make ready" costs.
- VMRI will provide reimbursement for make ready costs including:
 - Utility pole replacements
 - Mid-span pole installations
 - Undergrounding costs
 - Underground projects previously planned as aerial networks will also be considered



Eligibility

- Submitted by a unit of local government that has an existing FY2022 VATI project.
- Eligible VATI projects include:
 - Projects funded by:
 - State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund
 - Capital Projects Fund of the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021
 - Projects that have been determined by DHCD to be at risk of completion by December 31, 2026
 - Projects using local State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds as match to a VATI project will be considered



Application Process & Procedures

January 9, 2025	<u>Remaining funding, if not already allocated.</u>

- Any unobligated funds will carry over to the next review date.
- Unawarded applications may be resubmitted.
- Unallocated and unexpended funds will revert to the General Fund on June 30, 2025



Application Requirements

- The number, cost, and location of pole replacements or mid-span pole installations.
 - Direct and Indirect Passings Form (available in CAMS)
 - Pole Replacement and Mid-Span Pole Installation Form (available in CAMS)
 - Shapefiles of points, direct project passings, and broadband infrastructure route to-be-funded

Application Requirements

2. Documentation to establish that the pole replacements or mid-span pole installations have been or will be completed within 120 calendar days of the receipt of funds.

- Project timelines that display completion within 120 calendar days of receipt of funds or;
- Documentation of prior completion on or after January 1, 2024
- Documentation on how the project timeline for make-ready work aligns with the most up-to-date timeline for VATI project
- For undergrounding applications, longer completion timelines will be considered by request.



Application Requirements

3. Documentation sufficient to establish the costs for which funds are requested
 - Derivation of Costs Form (available in CAMS)
 - Funding Sources Table (available in CAMS)
 - For aerial build projects, documentation from the utility owner detailing costs



Application Requirements

4. Documentation that demonstrates estimated project costs for utility pole replacements and mid-span pole installations were included in the approved fiscal year 2022 Virginia Telecommunication Initiative project budget.

- Attach approved 2022 VATI contract budget, including supplemental information, as necessary to clearly identify the originally budgeted make-ready estimated costs and the basis of such estimation.
- Documentation that substantiates make-ready costs exceed those originally budgeted



Application Requirements

5. Narrative statement stating how funds will accelerate the project.
 - Estimates with and without funding received under VMRI



Application Requirements

6. For undergrounding applications:

- Documentation that aerial construction make ready expenses would exceed \$30,000 per mile
 - Applicants wishing to proceed with undergrounding prior to receipt of an award may seek pre-approval from the Office of Broadband to commence undergrounding prior to application submission, and subsequently apply for already incurred undergrounding costs. **MUST ACKNOWLEDGE THE RISK OF NOT BEING AWARDED.**
- If applicable, documentation that demonstrates the potential increase in route mileage by utilizing public rights-of-way.
- Documentation that the undergrounding timeline aligns with currently approved milestone timeline. If not, must provide updated milestone timeline.



Supplemental Application Conditions

- No more than \$30,000 per mile in reimbursements can be applied for. Any application requesting more will be disregarded entirely.
- No more than 10% of the original VATI award may be requested or awarded
- No less than 25% in matching funds (local or private) will be contributed to the application. In-kind resources will be considered in meeting the match requirement.
- A profit, fee, or other incremental charge above actual cost is not an allowable expense under VMRI.



Selection Process

Applications will be competitively scored, prioritizing eligible applications based on the following criteria:

- VATI project passings
 - Directly along network route
 - Indirectly based on locations reached
 - Estimates for indirect passing benefit will be accepted with justification for methodology



Selection Process

Cont.

- Matching funds
- Acceleration of VATI project completion
 - Narrative of project acceleration utilizing VMRI
- Cost effectiveness
- Project need



Application Review Process

- The Office of Broadband will review applications received under VMRI.
- Applicants will have 10 calendar days to respond to requests for additional information
- the Office of Broadband will recommend awards to the Governor's Office
- The Office of Broadband is available to offer technical assistance to applicants not awarded
- Unsuccessful applications may be resubmitted at a later application review date



Freedom of Information Act

For private business entities submitting proprietary information to the VMRI program may request protection from Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests pursuant to § 2.2-3705.6(3). Such entities shall submit the request for DHCD to apply the FOIA exemption in § 2.2-3705.6(3) in writing to vati@dhcd.virginia.gov.

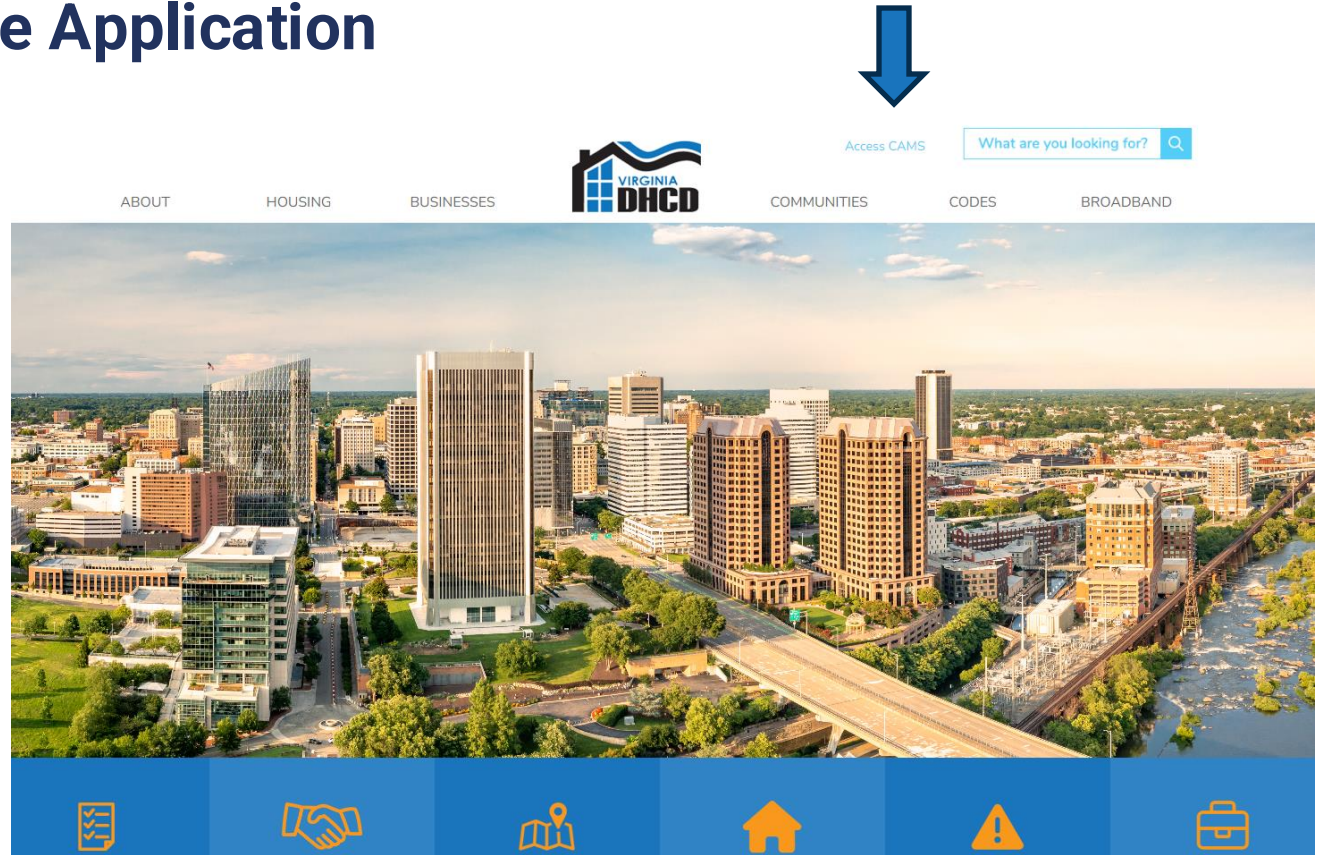


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Accessing the Application

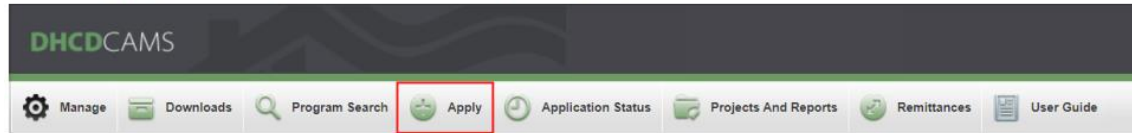
Centralized Application Management System (CAMS)

- Refer to the [CAMS user guide](#)
- Create application early
- Unit of local government must submit all documents
- Google Chrome is the recommended browser
- Save often by clicking “Save this Tab”
- Ensure Organizational Profile is up to date.



Applying

1. Login to CAMS.
2. Click **Apply** in the navigation bar at the top of the page.



3. Select a program from the dropdown list, or search "All Programs" to view all open applications for which your organization is eligible.
4. Click **Go**.
5. Click **Apply** to initiate an application for that program .

GO VA Per Capita Grants Region 1 (FY19)

The GO Virginia Per Capita Allocation Grant are funds available to the nine regional councils created by the Virginia Growth and Opportunity Act, to support grant requests that advance the Board's goals as well as the prioritized needs and opportunities identified in the Growth and Diversification plans adopted by each regional council. These grant funds are available to the regional councils on a per capita basis where each region gets a proportional share of the available funding based on its current population. Recommendations are reviewed by the Board in making final grant decisions and in approving the conditions and terms that will apply to each grant. It is expected that the grant funds will be used to initiate successful regional collaboration activities but will not be an ongoing source of long-term funding for grant requests.

Shapefile Requirements

- Shapefiles should be in .shp format
 - Must be functional and usable in ESRI's ArcGIS Pro
 - Submitted to CAMS in a zipped folder
- Polygon Shapefiles – polygons showing general project area, with names and passings counts for each project area attached to the polygons
- Point Shapefiles – points representing each project passing in a single layer, with address attribute data attached



Best Practices

- Ensure you are set up properly in CAMS
- Start application early
- Answer the question entirely
- Create application in Word doc and paste into CAMS.
- Reach out for technical assistance
- Have someone not familiar with the application review it
- The Primary Applicant **MUST** click 'Submit'

- ❑ Describe how the proposed project, if awarded, will accelerate delivery of the Virginia Telecommunication Initiative FY2022 Project. Include specific completion estimates with and without funding received through the Virginia Make Ready Initiative.
- ❑ Describe estimates and anticipated make ready costs in the VATI FY2022 project area when the original application was submitted in 2021, including how those costs and estimates were estimated and built into the original project budget.
