Delegate Kirk Cox was first elected from the 66th District to the House of Delegates in 1989. The 66th House District includes all of Colonial Heights and 13 precincts in Southern/Western Chesterfield County.

On December 5, 2010, the House Republican Caucus elected Kirk to serve as the House Majority Leader, the second highest leadership position in the House of Delegates.

In addition to his role as Majority Leader, Kirk serves on the House Appropriations Committee, the Chairman of the Appropriations Committee's Higher Education Subcommittee, and a Budget Conferee. He sits on two additional Appropriations Subcommittees- the Commerce, Agriculture, Natural Resources, and Technology Subcommittee; and the Elementary and Secondary Education Appropriations Subcommittee.
